RULES FOR VITA ANTIQUA AUTHORS

The editorial board accepts previously unpublished original scientific articles in Ukrainian, Russian (mostly for colleagues from the CIS countries) and English. The work should be structured according to the instructions below. More details at the link <http://vitaantiqua.org.ua/en/main> .

I. Structure of the article

I.1. Main part:

- ❖ *Surname and name of the author.*
- ❖ *Title of article.*
- ❖ *Abstract:* a few sentences about the topic and the main conclusions of the article / publication (not more than 200 words).
- ❖ *Keywords:* at least 5 characteristic words / phrases.
- ❖ *The main text of the article.*
- ❖ *The list of references.*
- ❖ *Summary in English.* If the work is in English - the resume is submitted in Ukrainian or Russian (for authors from Ukraine and CIS countries).
- ❖ *Information about the author (s)* (academic degree, position, institution, address of the place of work, e-mail) in English and the native language.

I.2. Additions:

- ❖ *The list of illustrations* (it should be on separate pages, written in English and the native language.).
- ❖ *Tables and/or diagrams should be in a separate file in *.rtf or *.doc (not *.docx) format with the same name as the main file with prefix _add.* Each table should be named as the following: Table 1. / Figure 1. The proportional ratio of flakes... ; Tables should not extend beyond the standard A4 paper with 2 cm indentation from page margins.

II. Text block.

Narrative submissions should be in Times New Roman font, size 14, spacing 1,5. All text materials except for text tables and/or diagrams should be in one file. **Text file should be saved in *.rtf or *.doc format (not *.docx).**

II.1. The main text of the article

The text should not have complex formatting, cross-references, etc. You can separately focus on a particular piece of text and highlight it with *italics* or **bold**. Least formatting will help to avoid the layout of your work.

The division of the main text into sections (introduction, methods, main part, discussion, results, conclusions) and subsections is welcome. Acknowledgments should be short, no more than 100 words.

II.2. Notes

Please do not use automatic footnotes. The numbering of notes in the text should be in square brackets: [1] and presented as a list after the main text (before the references). Make the notes when their meaning is difficult to include in the body of the text, or the display of their content would interrupt the text of the article, but it is critical for understanding the material. Notes should not include bibliographic material or if they can be stated in the acknowledgments.

II.3. Examples of links in the text of the article. For in-text citation, we kindly ask to use Harvard referencing style. For example:

❖ *on literature, semi-code in parentheses*

(Shydlovskiy 2005, p. 31—39, Fig. 1: 1, Table 1);

(Gladilin, Demidenko 1989, p. 143—178, Fig. 1: 1, Table 1);

(Usik, Rats, Kulakovskaya 2014, p. 197—206, Fig. 1: 1, Table 1);

(Chernovol et al. 2017, p. 115—141; Pichkur et al. 2019) — for more than three authors;

(ed. Videiko 2017) — link by the name of the editor of the volume.

❖ *on additions*

(fig. 1: 1), (table 1: 1).

III. A list of references

The list of references should be on separate pages. Literature is presented in alphabetical order. In the presence of DOI (Digital Object Identifier), its use is desirable in the links in full.

All references in Cyrillic must be submitted in Latin transcription. If there is a second title of the article in Latin alphabet (in the content and in the abstract of the cited work), the latter is used indicating the language of the main text.

You can use the Google Translator service to transliterate from Slavic languages.

IV. Summary.

The summary should be no less than 1800 symbols (on a separate page).

❖ First Name, Second Name (Ініціали) Last Name

- ❖ Title
- ❖ Summary (min. 1800 characters).
- ❖ Keywords: min 5 special terms.

The author's statement should be in the native language and in English, as follows:

V. Figures.

- ❖ Illustrations should be submitted in separate files. B / W and color raster illustrations are accepted in *.tif format with a resolution of at least 300 DPI without compression.
- ❖ Vector graphics are accepted in *.svg, *.eps, *.pdf formats. Digital photos can be sent in *.jpeg format with original resolution or reduced to 10x15 cm / 300 DPI.
- ❖ The maximum size of one illustration should not exceed an A4 sheet (21x29.7 cm) with margins of 2 cm on each side.
- ❖ *Under no circumstances send illustrations in a text file (*.doc, *.rtf, etc.). Such illustrations are not suitable for layout and printing!*
- ❖ All illustrative materials (drawings, photos, maps and diagrams, diagrams, tables with a predominance of images over texts, etc.) in the text should be called "Fig." and have a consistent numbering in the text.
